NEHEMIAH – WEEK 7 – JULY 26-AUGUST 1 "GOD'S HEROES HAVE HOPE!"

This week we are learning about Nehemiah! Nehemiah lived in a land called Susa and was a special helper to the King. One day, he heard about his people in Jerusalem and the trouble they were in. All of the walls of Jerusalem were broken which meant that the city was not protected! Nehemiah prayed to God that he would be able to help his people. You'll read in the book of Nehemiah how God answered his prayer, and how Nehemiah had hope, even when things were tough. He went through many trials and scary situations, but never stopped having hope that the walls would be rebuilt. So we're learning this week that God's heroes have hope! We can have hope because we know that our God will never leave us. We know that He will ALWAYS love us and that He wants to use us to bring His kingdom here to this Earth! Ready for the week? Let's hear you say it...God's heroes have hope!

Think about something in your life right now that feels hard or discouraging. Talk to God about that and ask Him, "How can I have hope in this?" Ask Him to give you the hope that comes from Him!

Keep going until the whole thing is erased. (Alternate: write the verse on a piece of paper and cross out a word with sharpie each time so you can't see it).
